Legislative Background for Joint Resolution 18-02

California is a new state in development exercising its Constitutional right to split from the State of California. The process to form New California is authorized and codified in Article IV, Section 3 of the United States Constitution:

"New States may be admitted by the Congress into this Union; but no new States shall be formed or erected within the Jurisdiction of any other State; nor any State be formed by the Junction of two or more States, or parts of States, without the Consent of the Legislatures of the States concerned as well as of the Congress."

On January 15, 2018, New California State declared its intent to form the State of New California. The following weeks and months, grievances have been read, and continue to be read, upon the steps of county courthouses across the state of California to give the constructive notice of its grievances and intent of independence as outlined in Article IV, Section 3 of the United States Constitution.

Undergirding the development of the New California State Constitution, on June 16, 2018 the New California State Executive Board approved the following preamble:

We, the representatives of the undersigned Counties within the State of California, seeking a republican form of government, protection against foreign invasion and domestic violence guaranteed by Article 4, Section 4 of the United States Constitution, and all privileges and immunities of citizens in the several states guaranteed by Article 4, Section 2 of the United States Constitution, resolve to establish New California as a fully vested State of the Union of States in the United States of America.

On July 21, 2018, at its first convention, the Executive Board presented to the duly elected County Assembly and Senate members a proposal to adopt the Preamble of the New California State Constitution. The legislative bodies of the Assembly and Senate met in separate sessions to discuss the proposed legislation and then came together to pass a joint resolution adopting the Preamble to the New California State Constitution.

NEW CALIFORNIA STATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 18-02

A Joint Resolution of the House and Senate of New California State Adopting the Preamble to the New State California Constitution

WHEREAS, with faith, diligence, and our sacred honor, we do hereby declare our Unity with Natural Law and the United States of America's Constitution; and

WHEREAS, we stand firm in our pledge to maintain and support the freedoms of the people of our Nation and New California at all times, at home and abroad. With God as our witness, honoring the foundational principles, we take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion, to stand together as free citizens of New California, to be a sovereign state of that nation which we hold dear, the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, we seek to remain a member of our Union, in order to form a more perfect Union we resolve to create the Free, Sovereign and Independent State of New California due to the past and current government of California having failed in their oath of office, obligations, and responsibilities as representatives of "We the People" to provide a republican form of government as guaranteed by Article IV, Section 4 of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, a preamble sets forth a document's fundamental purpose and guiding principles. The following preamble shall serve as the executive statement of declaratory intent for the New California State Constitution:

We, the representatives of the undersigned Counties within the State of California, seeking a republican form of government, protection against foreign invasion and domestic violence guaranteed by Article 4, Section 4 of the United States Constitution, and all privileges and immunities of citizens in the several states guaranteed by Article 4, Section 2 of the United States Constitution, resolve to establish New California as a fully vested State of the Union of States in the United States of America.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the people of the Counties of New California State do hereby adopt the June 16, 2018 Preamble to the New California State Constitution.

ADOPTED this 21ST day of July 2018 by unanimous consent.
